The cost of transportation also helps to cover your volunteer with liability insurance.



Northwoods Caregivers received a grant through ACT on Alzheimer's to help make Bemidji a more dementia-friendly

community.

ACT on Alzheimer's is a volunteer-driven, statewide collaboration preparing Minnesota for the personal, social and budgetary impacts of Alzheimer's. Bemidji is one of 12 new action communities working to prepare Minnesota for the growing number of people with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

Bemidji joins seven other pilot communities - Cambridge, Forest Lake, St. Louis Park, St. Paul, Walker, Willmar and the Twin Cities Jewish Community. Northwoods Caregiver's grant for Bemidji is funded through Blue Plus (an HMO affiliate of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Minnesota), the Medica Foundation, and Greater Twin Cities United Way.
