ACT on Alzheimer's

ACT on Alzheimer's Bemidji has a new name and new goals! Our new name "Giiwedinong" (pronounced gee-way-di-nong) means "The Northland", and reflects our geographic expansion from Bemidji to all of Northwoods Caregivers service area: Beltrami and Clearwater, northern Hubbard, northwestern Cass, and southern Koochiching Counties, and portions of the Red Lake, Leech Lake and White Earth Nations. We will continue our previous activities such as offering 2 free one-hour workshops from the Alzheimer's Association throughout this area, and distributing our Dementia Resource and Medical ID & Tracking Device brochures. We have two new committees to focus on groups that have somewhat different concerns/needs related to dementia: Native Americans and LGBTQ people. A doctoral nursing student, Tricia Cowan, is implementing a program called "Dementia Friends", that teaches community members simple ways to support people with dementia and their caregivers. She will be reaching out and offering these workshops in communities throughout our service area. Another committee is meeting to plan and start monthly Memory Café events where people with dementia and their caregivers will meet to socialize and engage in a variety of arts and music programs. This is a very exciting time for our ACT on Alzheimer's Action Team! Individual Abuse Prevention Plan (IAPP)

If you are currently receiving homemaking or respite care services from Northwoods Caregivers, you may have or will be getting a request from us for a visit to complete an Individual Abuse Prevention Plan (IAPP). The IAPP is a form designed to protect you that is now required under our MN Department of Human Services license. Completion of this document involves a conversation with one of our staff or quality assurance contractors (Jeanie and Jenn) and your legal representative if you have one. You may also invite a family member to join the discussion if you wish. This conversation will cover issues of possible sexual abuse, physical abuse,

self-abuse or neglect, and financial exploitation by someone in your life. In each of these areas, if there is a possibility that you are more vulnerable to abuse because of a physical, mental health, or other

condition, it outlines steps to protect you from such abuse.

Minnesota Department of Human Services

Completing the IAPP is for your benefit and protection as a person with a disabling or chronic condition.
